Battle of Britain 75th anniversary

On Sunday 20th September, cadets and Staff members from 422 joined the Corby RAFA branch for a parade and service for the 75th anniversary of the Battle of Britain. They carried their banners to St John's church where they sat with members of the congregation to join them in their service, taken by Rev. Paul Frost and his Curate. Afterwards, they had an opportunity to speak to some family and friends of veterans and took time to remember what great things the pilots did for the country 75 years ago.



422 (Corby) Squadron led by Flight Lieutenant Kev Ritchie RAFVR(T) 75 years ago, Hitler pushed Britain's allies to breaking point. The last line of defence from Germany's troops were the RAF pilots that were outnumbered four to one in the air. Hitler sent his bombers out to lure the last pilots out in the air to defeat them, however the RAF had other plans. The pilots went into the sky to fight around 4 to 5 times a day until Hitler lost enthusiasm and cancelled the plan.
